Principal's Reflection

As I watch the America's Cup races I am in awe of the innovation and creativity of the design team behind our Emirates Team New Zealand catamaran, I applaud the team for being courageous and implementing the "number 8 wire mentally" to use cycle power over the tradition grinding approach. As Tim Meldrum, the mechanical designer at Emirates Team New Zealand who has led the cycling project says, "It really goes against the tradition of an America's Cup and grand prix sailing culture that has been strong in grinding for 30 years. Thankfully we took a rational scientific approach that let the numbers speak for themselves." Watching the America's Cup I see the absolute value of creativity, science and technology, and team work, in our schools.

New Zealand Education is faced with a paradoxical dilemma of having to meet the unrealistically high expectations of 85% of all children meeting National Standards in reading, writing and mathematics on one hand, and delivering our innovative New Zealand curriculum that promotes the key competencies to develop lifelong connected learners that have the potential to lead the world.

Our challenge is to maintain our focus on providing a sound literacy and numeracy foundation while providing learning programmes that will nurture and promote creativity, develop curious minds, and provide our

students opportunities to take risks and come up with solutions, review and redesign.
