Focus for the Week: Workers in the Vineyard - Matthew 20: 1-15 Twenty Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

In Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus tells the parable of the workers in the vineyard, and how the owner of the vineyard paid all of the workers the agreed upon wages for the day, regardless of how many hours they had labored for him.

This was not well received by the workers who had toiled all day in the hot sun. Why should those men who had only worked for a couple of hours receive the same reward for only a fraction of the effort?

The owner of the vineyard is clear. Everyone agreed to the terms of work and he treated everyone fairly. Nobody should complain because he chose to be generous.

Sometimes it can seem as though we work so hard for what we have, whilst others seem to have everything so easy. It can be tempting to feel resentful of other people's good fortune. But how much do we really know about what goes on in other people's lives? It is important to remember that only God can see inside our hearts and only God knows what is really best for us.

Through Jesus, God has promised us all the same reward, everlasting life with Him in heaven. Some of us, fortunate enough to have been raised as Christians, will spend our whole lives striving to follow Jesus. Others, may only come to know Jesus later in life. Should we resent them being given the gift of eternal life like us? Or do we count ourselves fortunate to lead lives secure in the knowledge of God's love and rejoice for those who, however late, come to know that comfort and joy themselves?
