# Value Focus: Love of God, Self and Others – Week 2

### **Learner Agency**

Last week I shared some ways parents can help to promote a Growth Mindset approach in their children. Building on from a Growth Mindset is providing opportunities for our students to have agency over their learning. This is referred to as Learner Agency. Teachers are able to adapt their teaching and learning approach to facilitate a learning environment to enable our students to take an active role in their learning - this will look different at the different levels throughout the school. One example is allowing students to have choice in where they learn best - either on their own, with a buddy or in a small collaborative group. Classroom environments can be set up with a selection of furniture to allow the student to make these choices. The staff are working with an external educational consultant - Mrs Jo

Wilson from CORE education to upskill on collaborative teaching practices and learner agency. These staff meetings are very exciting and proving to be a real celebration of best practice across the school. We are starting to look at classroom furniture and will be purchasing classroom furniture to provide choice for students in where and how they learn best.
