#### Update on National Standards

Schools have been informed that our new government is going to make changes to the National Standards reporting requirements. However, all schools are required to meet the Education Act guidelines until legislative changes are made. In the meantime our teachers will make an Overall Teacher Judgement (OTJ) against National Standards on each of their students. Parents will receive this information as part of the End of Year reporting.

As you are well aware, National Standards have sat at the centre of many of the policies that have been introduced in the past decade. They have been the lynch pin and central measure of the performance of schools, students and teachers and the measure by which schools have been publicly compared through the construction of league tables. Minister Hipkins has made it clear that his ambition is to see every school a great school and does not subscribe to the global reform movement that has led us to our present place. He wants to see a shift in philosophy where we move from a 'one size fits all' standardised approach to a focus on bringing out the best in every individual student.

As we have developed comprehensive systems of assessment we will continue these best practices. We are just in the process of implementing an online reporting system which will enable us to enhance our reporting to parents using an online system.

Please be assured that high quality reporting to parents on the learning progress of their children is a paramount priority for us.


