Focus for the Week: First Sunday of Advent Mark 13:33-37

Sunday was the first Sunday of Advent, the beginning of the Liturgical Year in the church. We begin Cycle B of the Lectionary, which focuses our attention on the Gospel of Mark.

Today's Gospel reminds us that Advent is about more than our preparation for the Church's celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas. Advent is also about preparing ourselves for Christ's return in glory at the end of time. Like the disciples and the faithful in Mark's community, we must also stay alert and watchful. Our faithfulness to God, through the good times as well as the difficult times, shows us to be ready for the coming of the Son of Man.

The guidelines for how we should live our lives are outlined in the Ten Commandments. In understanding the meaning of the Commandments God asks that above all we heed "Love God", followed closely by "Love your neighbour". Indeed all the commandments are underpinned by these understandings. Jesus Christ died to strengthen our relationship with God and our neighbour.

He offered us a perfect example of how we should live according to God's will. One of the most powerful ways he showed us was to forgive others, even those who put him to death. When we forgive, we are doing as God asks, and as difficult as it may be to forgive those who have done us wrong, it begins a healing process, through which God gives us the power to continue with our lives.
