Message of Crib, Christmas tree



The Pope said that each year the Christmas Crib and the Christmas tree become a symbol of the compassion of the heavenly

Father, and his participation and closeness with humanity that feels it is not abandoned in the night of the times but is visited and accompanied amidst its difficulties.

The tree pointing up, he said, urges us to stretch out "towards the highest gifts", and rise above the mist that clouds, to feel how beautiful and joyous it is to be immersed in the light of Christ. In the simplicity of the crib we meet and contemplate the tenderness of God, manifested in that of the Child Jesus.

Where has this year gone. I knew when I started my first year as Principal at Marian Catholic School the weeks would be full of new learning, meeting lots of new people, new students and their families, new activities and new ways of working as I experienced my first year in this wonderful school.
