

Focus for the Week: Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord.



At this time every year we hear the story of Jesus' betrayal, passion and death. We can imagine the grief and confusion of the apostles as Jesus was taken from the garden of Gethsemane, to be whipped and beaten, crowned with thorns, and made to carry His cross for His own execution. The apostles were asked to walk that road of suffering with Jesus - and so are we. Today we remember and celebrate what Jesus has done for us. He gave His life so that we could be free. 
