
Cathedral Confirmation, **First Communion and Reconciliation Programme**

Wasps Gwynne Shield Rugby Team 2018

The tournament is a prestigious tournament to be held in the first week of the July school holidays, at the Hautapu Rugby grounds, Cambridge. This tournament has been going since the early 1920's. This tournament is for young boys and girls who are 56 kgs and under, who are Year 8 or below. Normally the players come from the intermediate school level, however we do have the odd Year 6 who is an exceptional player that does get selected.

This is a Primary and Intermediate school based tournament which means you must trial for the team in the area in which you go to school. The other difference is, you don't have to play rugby to be eligible but you still must trial to enable selection. All players who play in this tournament have the opportunity to be selected for the Waikato Roller Mills.

As your schools fall within the 'Wasp' area, those involved in selecting players would like to choose the strongest team to represent all of our schools: Peachgrove, St Josephs, Newstead, Marion, Matangi, Knighton Rd, Southwell, Tamahere, Hamilton East, Te Ara Rima (5thAvenue), Eureka, Silverdale, Tōku Māpihi Maurea.
