Focus for the Week

Reflection on Gospel of Mark 3:20-35 (10th Sunday of Ordinary Time)

In the Gospel reading on Sunday, Jesus looked at those around him with the same kind of love and affection that he holds for his own family. He recognised that God's love is beyond the ties of blood and genes.

Why do you think that Jesus would compare his own family to the people around him?

When we come to Mass, we see that we are all different but we all belong. As followers of Jesus, we try to see everyone as family.

Spiritually, we are all bound together as members of God's great family, as close to Jesus as his own family. What distinguishes us as members of God's family is the family likeness of doing God's will – living the loving way.

A HUGE thank you to the wonderful parents who are working on the gates at the



SCHOOL LOGO

The BOT have approved the new school logo. We will now develop clear branding guidelines for the school. In regard to school uniforms there will be a two year phase



in period for the new logo. New uniforms will be a mixture of current school logo and new school logo depending on stock levels in particular sizes. Students will be able to wear uniform items with the current logo. NZ Uniforms will not be increasing the cost of uniform items with the new school logo. Schooltex (The Warehouse) will increase uniform items with the new school logo by \$4.00.



We will use the new school logo on school documentation as soon as our branding guidelines are completed. I would like to thank our parent community for your feedback on our two recent surveys which has provided a clear indication to the Board.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES PARENT REP

A casual vacancy has occurred on the board of trustees for an elected parent representative. With regret, the Board of Trustees accepted the resignation of Sean Botherway at our April meeting. However, due to a change of circumstances Sean is now able to continue on the Board. The BOT agreed at their meeting last night to fill the casual vacancy by selection. Before we can confirm Sean Botherway's selection we need to work through the following process.

The board has resolved under section 105 of the Education Act 1989 to fill the vacancy by selection. If ten percent or more of eligible voters on the school roll ask the board, within 28 days of this notice being published, to hold a by-election to fill the vacancy, then a by-election will be held.
