Focus for the Week

Following Jesus

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

In this week's Gospel Jesus and His disciples ignored one of the many rules that the Pharisees had created. This made the Pharisees very angry.

Jesus tells the Pharisees that the outward appearance of people can be misleading. We have to look into their hearts and see what is inside, to know if they are filled with God's goodness. Rather unkind thoughts, acts of selfishness, being unkind, speaking unkindly are what makes peoples' hearts unclean. What goes on inside our hearts is what really matters, especially to God.

When our hearts are set on God they are freed from the multitude of human rules that tie us down, that stop us having a direct, personal relationship with God and prevent proper action and worship.

Today we are invited to consider what changes we need to make in order to live the Christian life more fully? What changes do I need to make today to become a person of greater integrity?

To live a creative life we must lose our fear of being wrong. Sometimes we are afraid to try new things, are afraid to speak up and are scared about making decisions in case what we try, say or do is not "perfect" or "right". Remember it is Okay to make mistakes because that is the way we learn.

It feels good to admit that you don't know something. Nobody expects you to know about everything, but it is still kind of brave to admit it. If you accept to yourself that you don't know something, you question more and assume things less.

It is also Okay to say sorry if you **do** something wrong, it just means we need to think of ways to make it right. Making mistakes is part of life. God is forgiving.
