Focus for the Week

'Be Opened' Mark 7: 31-37

In Sunday's gospel Jesus healed the deaf man saying the words, "Be opened". From that moment on, the man was able to speak clearly and make himself understood. Jesus had totally changed the man's life through his act of kindness. The man's life would never be the same again.

Jesus invites us to "Be opened." He asks us to be open every day. Just as Jesus cured the physically deaf so can He cure the spiritually deaf. By opening ourselves to His Spirit in our lives, we are able to hear and proclaim the good news of Jesus clearly. Let the warmth of Jesus' love fill us and open us to his presence and like the man, our lives will not be the same again.
