<u>Focus for the Week</u>: The Camel and the Needle Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 10: 17-30

In this week's Gospel we hear a man ask Jesus what he needed to do to make sure he would go to heaven. Jesus told him to follow God's commandments. Jesus then told the man to give away all his money and everything he owned. The man went away feeling sad because everything he owned meant more to him than the message of Jesus.

In the gospel, Jesus said it was easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. Jesus wants us to realise that having money can often make us greedy and selfish and forgetful about the needs of others. He wants us to understand that by living faithfully on Earth, being generous and loving we will be blessed with everlasting life in heaven.

Hamilton City Council are launching a campaign this



week for all the schools in Hamilton – Mix it up at school pick up.

Schools in Hamilton face the same re-occurring problems when it comes to the

issues around their school gates. Congestion, poor parking and general bad driving behaviour seem to intensify out the front of school gates across Hamilton especially in the afternoons. The Council, and Police are committed to working with schools to improve safety and the Council has put infrastructure in place to make the areas as safe as possible, but we can't do it all on our own. We need your help!

Be a 3pm superhero, try alternative transport options:

- Park down the road or around the corner away from the busy school gate
- Walk, bike and scooter at least once or twice a week
- o Carpool with families in your area.

Reminder - school day finishes at 3.00pm

I am noticing on some days many children are still waiting for their parents in front of the Whare at 3.15pm when our after school duty finishes. On these days some children are still waiting as late as 4.00pm. Without adult supervision this poses a health and safety risk for our children.

We operate an excellent After School Care programme and parents are able to use this service on a casual basis. For 3.00pm to 4.15pm the cost would range from \$10.00 per child through to \$6.00 for three children per day. I encourage parents to consider booking into our ASC programme on days they won't make a 3.00pm pick up.
