#### <u>Focus for the Week</u>: Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King John 18: 33-37

In this week's Gospel we learn about the importance of telling, listening and understanding the truth. Pilate asked Jesus if he was a King. Jesus tried to explain to Pilate that he was not a King who belonged to this world, but that he had come into the world to share his kingdom of love and goodness. Pilate didn't understand what Jesus said nor did he live the truth. Even though he declared Jesus not guilty, he still allowed Him to be crucified.

We need to listen to the truth even when we don't want to hear it and speak the truth even when it's inconvenient.

Congratulations to all those of our Marian community who celebrated their First Holy Communion and Confirmation on this special day, the Feast of Christ the King, during the 10.30 Mass at the Cathedral.
