Focus for the Week

Trust in God Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time In Sunday's readings, Jesus' message was very

clear. On one side He offered happiness and on the other sorrow. Those followers of Jesus he had blessed, would be the hungry, weeping and rejected. While those who were rich, well fed, held in high regard and happy would become sorrowful. What is going on here? Choosing Jesus doesn't necessarily mean comfort and fulfilment. In fact it seems at times to mean being ridiculed and scorned.

But in the second reading from Saint Paul to the Corinthians we are reminded that we are a resurrection people and that we have been given great hope and promise in the new life that Jesus holds out to us when we join Him in Heaven.

And again the prophet Jeremiah reminds us, "happy are those who trust in the Lord."

This week parents have been emailed a Statement of Accounts. These can also be accessed through your child's LINC-ED profile. This invoice covers all costs the school is charged for, for your child during the year. The teachers work to ensure all planned activities are covered within this invoice. On the invoice the School Donation has been separated out. This is to meet Audit requirements as the government insists that we have a 'free education' system. However the reality is we do not receive adequate Ministry funding to provide the teaching and learning programmes we believe meets the educational needs of our students. The school donation, a voluntary payment, is relied on to support our Operational Funding and payments to the Diocese for the land we purchased to build the Gerry Sullivan Events Centre. We encourage families to

HAPARA - Keeping our students safe

Students in LC 3-5 frequently use chromebooks to access and create their learning. Their teachers all use Hapara to support their learning programmes using digital technologies. Hapara is a tool designed by NZ schools and used around the world to support learners develop their digital citizenship skills through using Google Education. It creates a safe digital learning environment for our Marian Catholic School students. Hapara also enables our teachers to also personalize learning experiences and provide relevant feedback to students. There is a \$5 charge per student each year. You may have noticed that this Hapara charge has been added to the school fee list for these Learning Communities.
