#### Lockdowns / Reversed Evacuation Drill

In response to the recent Christchurch terrorist attack the police have been asked to visit each school and talk about their preparedness for a Lockdown (or Reversed Evacuation). We were visited last week by a local Police Officer and he requested a copy of our Lockdown Procedures and talked through our system and any areas where I felt we needed support. The Police Officer told me that the Police are going to instigate 'Lockdowns' in schools to assist the school with their readiness for a situation where a Police Lockdown may be required. I appreciate the Police being proactive and offering any support needed. I am aware that the Ministry of Education is planning a review of Lockdown Procedures during Term Two. From time to time a school may need to go into 'Lockdown' deemed necessary by Senior Leadership or the Police. For example; a swarm of bees in the playground, or a Police instigated lockdown.

I feel communication with our parent community is a crucial component of our Lockdown Procedure. We are planning a scheduled 'Lockdown Drill' next week and we will be communicating through our SchoolAPP to all parents. The teachers will be talking to their classes about why we need to practise, and the behaviour expectations.

Last week we held the first of our Learning Discussions. I would like to thank the parents who meet with the teachers to discuss their children's learning.
