Focus for the Week

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Luke 10: 38-42

The story of Mary and Martha is very well known. There is more to the story than two women, one of whom was very busy trying to be hospitable while the other sat at Jesus' feet and listened to him, and with whom Jesus appears to side. We can feel for Martha. Jesus arrives, possibly with his disciples as well and Martha is busy preparing everything so that the mob could be fed. Little wonder that she gets annoyed with her sister who apparently is doing nothing to help serve the guests but instead sits at Jesus' feet and listens to him.

While Martha is anxious and worried, Jesus points out to Martha that Mary has chosen the better part, to welcome the Lord, to be present with the Lord, to keep one's life focused on the Lord, to come to know the presence of God in all parts of her life.

Being in tune with God –listening to Jesus-is the key to a fruitful life.

Charism Focus

Our Charism focus for this term is LIVE COMMUNITY. This week we will focus on showing love and concern for others. Being part of a community means we need to think of others. Thinking and acting as Jesus would -doing what is good for **all** of us - not just thinking of ourselves. Is an important part of being in community. This includes how we welcome new students and visitors. Do we welcome them positively and think of how we can make their stay or visit a positive one? How

can we show our love and concern for those who are visiting or new to our school?

To **Live Community** at Marian Catholic School means for us to be aware of those around us - to show love, concern and respect for those we spend our day with. To think like Jesus and to do what is good for us all not just thinking of ourselves. To be the hands, face and voice of Jesus.

Welcome back to Term Three

Hopefully the holidays came at a good time for your families and you have been able to either recover or miss the nasty winter virus that hit many of us at the end of Term Two. My wish is that you have all had a restful holiday break and been able to enjoy the change in routines.

During the holidays the teachers were involved in a number of different courses.

- We had seven teachers complete a three day Religious Education paper - Introduction to Catholicism. This paper is one of the requirements for all teachers who teach Religious Education in our Catholic Schools.
- Fourteen teachers attended a two course on 'Teaching as Inquiry' which helps to build a culture of professional inquiry in our school.
- Three teachers attended a Learning through Play course where the content focussed on the



developmental stages of Years 4-8 students and highlighted how student agency can super charge the learning outcomes with engaging, practical, hands on learning.

 One teacher attended a three day residential course on 'Godly Play'. Godly play is a way for children to encounter the Scriptures through storytelling, imagination and play.

With each of the courses above our teachers worked with teachers from other Catholic Schools. This is a direct benefit of being in the Waikato Catholic Kahui Ako. There is a wealth of quality professional development available for all our schools.
