Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Luke 12: 32-48

Sunday's Gospel reading reminds us that Jesus trusted

His disciples to carry on His work of curing the sick,
forgiving sinners and sharing the Good News of Christ

with the world after He had gone. After Pentecost the
disciples did what Jesus had asked them to do and
shared everything they had seen and heard with
others.

Who is trusted to do the work of Jesus today? Each one of us has a part to play in sharing the good news of the Gospel with other people. We share Christ's message with others by our words and actions, by being kind, forgiving and loving just as Jesus was. By sharing our faith we will be rewarded with joy, happiness and everlasting life.


Shout to our PTFA
