# **Gospel Reflection: Few Will Be Chosen**

Twenty-first Sunday of Ordinary Time Luke 13: 22-30 In Sunday's gospel reading, Jesus reminds us that the way to God's kingdom is by following God's way through our words and actions. This isn't easy to do, and throughout our lives we will often fail and make mistakes. Although many will turn away from God's life because it is too hard, with God's help, we can carry on. Each of us must try to live our lives every day as well as we possibly can. A good way of starting each day is to say the morning offering, a special prayer in which we offer all our thoughts and actions of the coming day to God. By offering our words and actions to God, we will be ready to greet Him at the end of time and share in His everlasting happiness.
