# Gospel Reflection: Luke 18: 9-14

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In Sunday's gospel we are given guidance in how we should pray in the parable of two men who are praying in the temple. The Pharisee in the parable is a good man was devoted to the Church, fasted frequently, was generous with his contributions to charity and faithful to his marriage. He stood at the front of the temple with his head held high listing the many sacrifices he had made for the Lord. The tax collector stood towards the back of the temple with his head and eyes bowed, acknowledging his sinfulness and begging God's mercy.

We are told that the second man will be exalted and the first will be humbled. Real humility recognises that it is not our work but God's. A humble person says, 'There but for the grace of God, go I.' We thank and praise God, not for what we have become, but for his grace which has made all things possible.

These funds that have been raised will be made available to three Champagnat Marist Pre-schools which we are supporting as part of our Marist mission here on the Atoll of Tarawa in Kiribati. Pre-school education is still largely in its early stages in Kiribati. We Marist Brothers, with the support of our Mission Stewardship team, comprised of five Lay Champagnat Marists and two Brothers, are overseeing and supporting the Catholic, Marist and professional development our three pre-schools and ensuring they meet Catholic Education Office and Government requirements." #### DIWALI

Our Teacher-Aide, Mrs Florence Chatelier shares her culture and the special festival with our students.

Diwali is an important Hindu festival also known as the 'Festival of Lights'. During Diwali people light lamps called 'diyas' in their homes which symbolises the victory of light over darkness, or good over evil.

Diwali is five days long – each day having a different significance and different prayer rituals. On the first day, it is considered auspicious to buy gold jewellery. On the second day, people light lamps and decorate the entrance to their homes with colourful 'Rangolis'. On the third day, which is Diwali, people wear new clothes and give gifts to their family and friends. A lot of Indian sweets and savoury dishes are prepared and shared with family and friends. Children light firecrackers too. The fourth day is the beginning of the new year. The fifth day is a day when brothers visit their married sisters who welcome them with a meal.

Diwali is celebrated around the globe and many countries hold multicultural events to mark this day. Rangolis signify showering of good luck and prosperity



on the house and family. At Marian Catholic School, Diwali was celebrated by drawing of colourful Rangolis our Indian by Cultural Club at various places in school. the All students of the school joined with

them as one community in creating these colourful patterns and celebrating together. We would like to wish all our Marian Catholic School community a very Happy Diwali!
