Focus for the Week

Gospel Reflection: Gospel Luke 23: 35-43 Feast of Christ the King

In Sunday's gospel reading we hear the story of Jesus' crucifixion. Even when the leaders, soldiers and one of the criminal's taunt Jesus they use the words 'the Chosen one, the King of the Jews.' These people also repeatedly use the word 'saved'; he saved others ...let him save himself ...save yourself as well as us.

They are acknowledging what we proclaim in faith, that Jesus Christ is our Saviour. We are called to commit ourselves to be followers of Christ and to the building of his kingdom. To do this we must model our lives on all that Jesus has taught us.

Finally, please know I have an open-door policy and welcome your ideas, concerns and questions at any time. We have so many people in our community who care passionately about our school. This is a great thing and I want nothing more than a culture where we are all comfortable to have brave conversations at any time. I welcome any suggestions you may have about how we can do this better into the future.
