Focus for the Week

Gospel Reflection: Turn the Other Cheek Matthew 5: 38-48 Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's gospel was perhaps one of the most famous of all - Jesus tells his disciples to turn the other cheek.

We are told to love as God loves; that is, all people, even those we do not like and who do not like us. It is easy to be kind to those who are kind to us but God wants us to help build his kingdom here on Earth by being kind, loving and forgiving to those who hurt us too.

In the Lord's Prayer we ask God to forgive us, as we forgive those who trespass against us. If we want forgiveness and understanding for our sins, we must first show that same forgiveness and understanding to others.

Charism Focus

Our Charism Focus for this term is the value of LIVE LOVE. The gospel tells us how Jesus asks us to love our enemies.

By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples: if you love one another" John 13:35

Being disciples of Christ we are asked to show love to others. To love as God loves us. Not just those that we like and that like us - but everyone. Even those who may have upset or hurt us,

To be the hands, face and voice of Jesus means that we are able to show the love that God has for us with everyone. In our small way we can be peacemakers: by offering our friendship to everyone we meet; and

by learning to say sorry and forgive others that have hurt us.

May your Ash Wednesday be a time of reflection and promise.

This morning the whole school attended Mass for Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Children will make Lenten Promises in class and parents may like to encourage their children to reflect upon what regular penances they will perform throughout this season of Lent. An idea could be that each member of the family choose his/her own personal penance as well as some good act that he/she will perform (daily spiritual reading, daily Mass, extra prayers, almsgiving, volunteer work, housecleaning, etc.), and the whole family may wish to give up one thing together (TV, movies, desserts) or do something extra as a family.

Rangiāowhia Commemorations

On Friday LC 5 students (Year 7-8), staff and parents attended the commemoration celebrations Rangiāowhia, Te Awamutu. Rangiāowhia



thriving village in the Waikato where Māori and Pākehā lived together. They shared languages, trade, education and religion. Then on February 21, 1864, the British Crown soldiers raided the prosperous village in the Waipā district, as part of an overall plan to destroy the Kingitanga movement. Today the commemorations focus on what can be learnt from the war and the importance of actively seeking peace. Thank you to the teachers and Te Korowai, Matua Peter and Whaia Karen for their work preparing our students in order for them to gain rich understandings from the day. Thank you to all the parents who attended and helped with supervision.

Opening of the Marcellin Gymnasium at St John's College Mrs Toni Walters-Freke and I attended this opening ceremony. The new gymnasium is an amazing custom-built facility that the college will enjoy for years. The opening ceremony was excellent with the Bishop, and elderly Marcellin Brother, and Prime Minister Jacinda Adern. The boys were impressive - beginning with a very moving 'Challenge' by their kapahaka group, their singing, and their behaviour. What struck me was there was a lot of pride - by the students, the staff and the parents and guests who felt part of the school and their achievements. I was feeling proud to be a contributing school of St John's College, and part of Catholic education.

Our PM - Jacinda Adern spoke brilliantly to the boys one of her key messages was: teenage years are very challenging, it is OK to feel that you are not coping at times, while this generation of teenagers is the most connected through Social Media, they are reporting feeling the most loneliness. She told the boys - do not feel you have to 'man up and get on with it' seek help that's OK.

Rangiaowhia

Last Friday all of the students from Learning Community 5 (LC5), along with their teachers and a group of parents travelled to Rangiaowhia to be involved in the Commemoration ceremony. It was a very moving and memorable day and the students represented our school very well.

Rangiaowhia is an important pilgrimage site for our diocese. It was the centre of the Church's mission in the Waikato from 1844 until 21 February 1864 when over 1000 troops rode in and destroyed the village, burned people alive and took prisoners. Every year the diocese, along with Ngāti Apakura, commemorate what happened. Rangiaowhia was a peaceful, economically thriving village, exporting produce around the motu and overseas.
