Focus for the Week

Gospel Reflection: The Holy Spirit Comes Pentecost Sunday John 20: 19-23

In Sunday's gospel, the disciples had gathered together to pray in an upper room. Jesus appears among them offering greetings of peace and letting them see His Wounds. Then Jesus breathes new life into the disciples so that they were filled with courage and were now ready to continue God's work of forgiveness and witness to the world. Christ gave them the breath of new life as the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit helped the disciples to know God more fully and gave them the strength to take up the challenges that are ahead.
